Past and Present Members,

The organization has heard from several members expressing frustration and inquiring about the status of the Oklahoma Ornithological Society. The organization has heard you. The Board shares those same feelings with the organization's current hiatus in fulfilling its functional obligations, particularly those of communicating with members through publications of the Newsletter and Bulletin.

Like many individuals and organizations, the global pandemic had a profound impact on the OOS. We understand that this is not unique to the OOS. Virtual meetings were a new challenge. 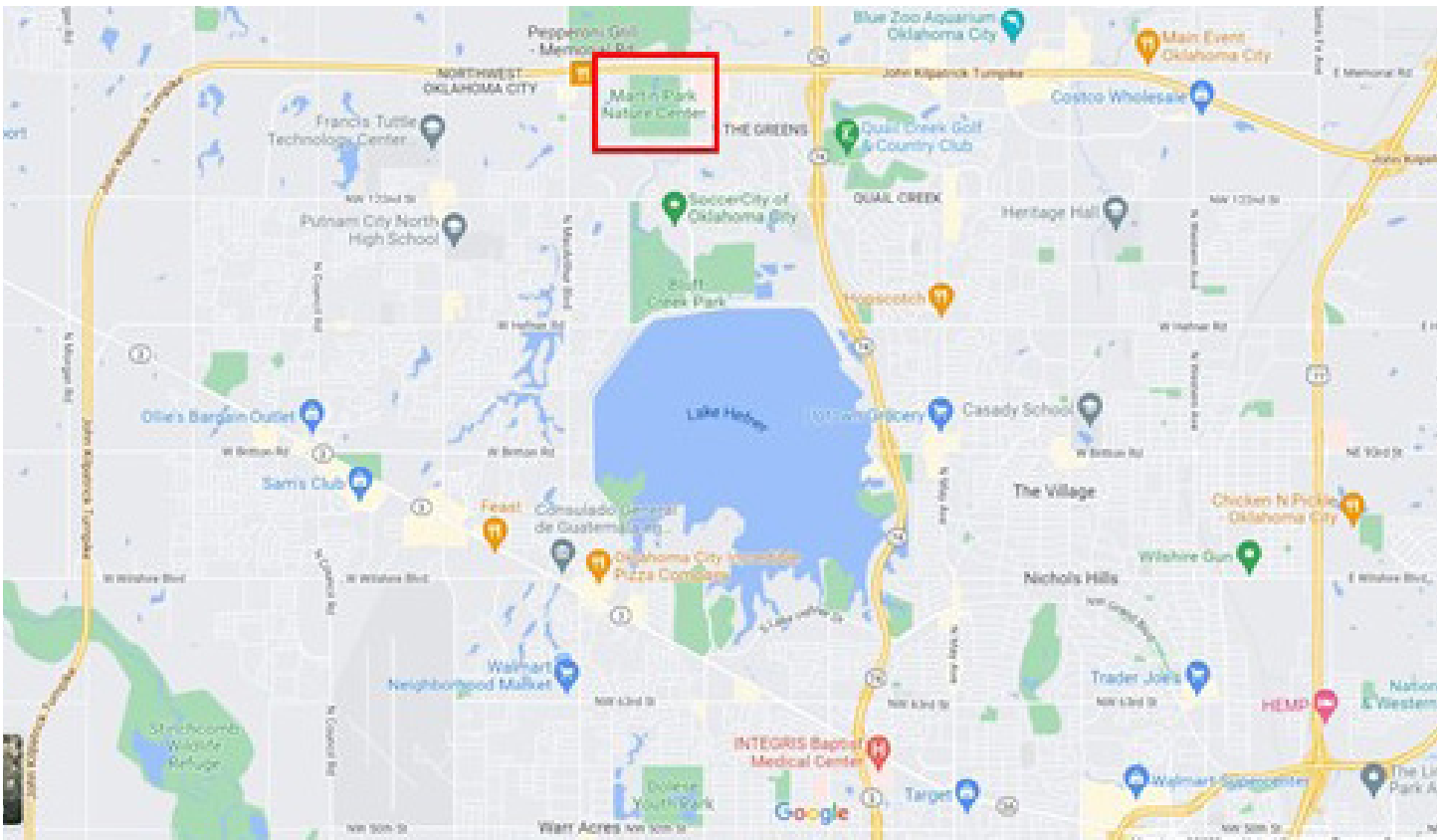

Bird Friendly Glass Retrofit Product Review of Feather Friendly Bird Tape

In recent years, much effort and research has been dedicated to quantifying the impact of bird collisions with human structures in the US and worldwide. It's estimated that 100 million to 1 billion birds die from window collisions in the United States annually (Loss et al, 2014).

Recently, my family moved into a home with a large picture window. Although I haven't noticed any birds colliding with the window, I realize that it has the potential to be hazardous and wanted to mitigate that risk. There are a wide variety of products on the market that claim to be "bird-friendly" with which to

retrofit windows. In fact, there are so many that selecting one can be a challenge. Luckily, the American Bird Conservancy (ABC) has put many of these products to the test and has compiled the results on their website (<https://abcbirds.org/glass-collisions/products-database/>). This is a tremendous resource and I only considered products that were ABC approved. While that narrowed the options significantly, there were still over a hundred options to choose from. With continued research, I selected Feather Friendly® decal tape as a good fit for my purpose.

Feather Friendly® is a Canadian company whose product is on the ABC approved list. It is installed like a window film to the outside surface of the window, but the backing is removed, leaving only “dots.” The “dots” are ¼” square vinyl decals on 2” spacing. I ordered a 100’ roll of tape online for 21 Canadian Dollars including shipping (<https://store.featherfriendly.com/feather-friendly-solution-for-do-it-yourself-residential-applications/>). This equates to just over \$17 USD in total. Delivery was prompt (one week), with no issues. A 100’ roll of Feather Friendly® tape should cover 16 square feet of glass, at the ABC’s recommended 2” spacing.

Upon receipt, I opened the envelop and was pleased. Everything that I needed for application was in the kit! Included was the tape roll, two disposable (paper) measuring tapes, and a squeegee. Also included were clear instructions and diagrams. After reading the directions and about 15 minutes of prep work on the window, I was ready to start application.

Application was tedious, slow, and somewhat frustrating at first. I’d estimate that the first 1/3 of the window accounted for about half of the total application time. Eventually, I got the feel for the application technique and made quick work of the rest. Total prep and application time was about 90

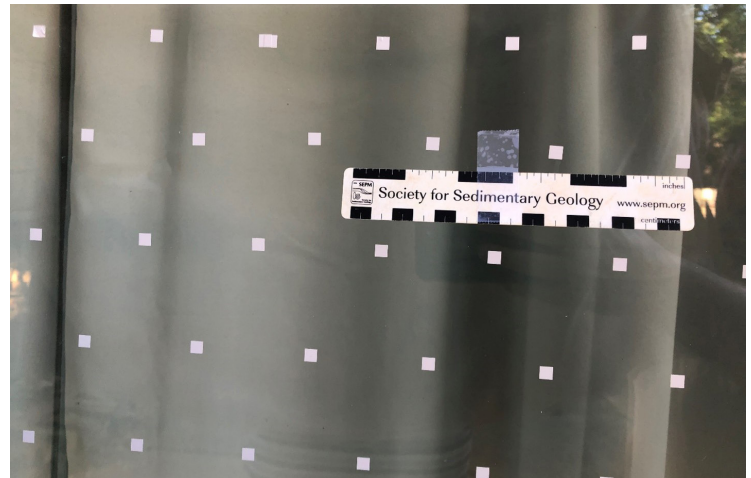


Photo of outside surface of a portion of window after application of Feather Friendly® window treatment. Ruler for scale.

minutes.

In summary, this is a cheap and relatively easy retrofit to windows to minimize bird collision hazards. After experience applying the product, I would order it again, and would recommend this product to others. I look forward to many years of collision free living! It also looks great.

Pros: ABC approved, minimal impact on window aesthetics, no impact on window functionality, cheap, clear directions, and helpful tools included in kit.

Cons: Learning curve, I wasted product before mastering technique.

Noteworthy Records of Birds in Oklahoma Spring 2021

The Oklahoma Ornithological Society is looking to post collective seasonal summaries of noteworthy birds recorded in Oklahoma gathered through and supported by the Oklahoma Bird Records Committee and/or eBird, and/or the Oklahoma Ornithological

Society Facebook page and other sources. A list of observations for the Spring 2021 season (March to May) is given below, and will soon be available at the OOS website—under Oklahoma Bird Records Committee.

These summaries will be posted ahead of the following year's season to alert members of what was observed the year before, and what might be seen in the coming season as well as highlight what bird observations are or would be noteworthy.

This collective service is made available through the Oklahoma Ornithological Society as a service to the Oklahoma birder community. The following is a listing of noteworthy records of birds for the Spring period—March-May 2021. It incorporates records outside or near limits of expected occurrence delimited by the DATE GUIDE to the Occurrences of Birds in Oklahoma, Seventh Edition (Oklahoma Bird Records Committee (OBRC), 2019 Oklahoma Ornithological Society, Norman, OK). Also included are noteworthy high counts. Exceptional records reviewed and found acceptable by the Oklahoma Bird Records Committee are given in bold. Species whose names are followed by an (R) are expected, but RARE in very low frequencies. Underscores depict records for date or locality outside the limits specified in the DATE GUIDE. m. ob. =

multiple observers.

The observations below show patterns within species and species groups. Black-bellied Whistling-Ducks are showing a spread across eastern and central Oklahoma to west-central edges in Alfalfa and Cotton counties. However, other marshland species such as King Rails, Common Gallinules and Least Bittern are not yet showing such a spread indicating few source birds to rebuild populations that occupied those areas during wetter cycles. Red Slough WMA in southeastern Oklahoma remains a stronghold for these species in the state. White Ibises have seen a significant uptick there. Inca Doves have also shown limited re-spread into areas they reached ten-years previous.

Early arrivals have been a recent pattern, but depicted this season in a limited way. Whooping Cranes appeared this season in March, slightly ahead of the previous pattern. More noticeable is the westward thrust of eastern songbirds such as thrushes and warblers, but nothing to scale with that during the 2020 spring. Some significant rarities appeared, the most significant being the first state record for **Zone-tailed Hawk**, and second state record for **Limpkin**.
